September Is National School Attendance Awareness Month: Engaging Families to Reduce Chronic Absence

As we begin this school year, I want to thank you and your staff for all you have done to support our students and their families during these incredibly difficult times. I invite you to join me in welcoming all families back to our school communities where this year provides us the opportunity to create positive and supportive conditions for learning that foster healing and elevate the strengths of every student.

This school year, it is more important than ever for us to celebrate **September as National School Attendance Awareness Month** and increase consistent student attendance throughout our state. I urge you to use this national attendance awareness month as a catalyst to launch proactive student and family engagement campaigns geared toward increasing consistent attendance and ultimately raising academic outcome indicators.

It is encouraging that several indicators showed attendance rates rebounded last year with a return to in-person instruction. However, we know that chronic absentee rates remain at an all-time high.
