This webinar will provide an overview of Caring Conversations, a strategic framework and structure for early childhood educators and administrators when communicating with families about attendance concerns. Meaningful connections with students and families are essential to regular pre-K attendance and participation, whether learning is taking place in school or at home.

During this session, we will revisit our core data points for staying connected to families and hear from educators about strategies they've put in place to connect with and engage students and families during these challenging times.
